

In 1694, a young man named Johannes Kelpius came ashore in Philadelphia with a group of about forty men and women. He brought them to the nearby Wissahickon Valley where they built a huge tabernacle crowned with an astronomical observatory. For over fourteen years, Kelpius's community flourished in the midst of rumors of mystical practices and secret rites. For three hundred years, tales of the supernatural have persisted.

The historical facts are scant, but what we do know suggests that the truth behind Kelpius's story is every bit as fascinating as the legends.
